

No. 1 – Template Studies + Basic Research + Reading **City of Houston**

Due January 16, NOON – Note: Preliminary progress deadlines also apply. Must be posted to student folder by deadline.

Exploring resources to get to know the city is important to the work you will be doing this semester in this design studio.

Mapping the city through the development of ‘template studies’ which communication your understanding of the city is a way of creating a visual language about place and its form.

Assignment Objective:

- To develop a general understanding of the city through observation and representation.
- To develop a series of ‘template studies’ which represent the student’s interpreted ‘language’ of the city’s form.

WHAT YOU WILL TURN IN:

A power point presentation which has two components – Basic Research & Template Studies.

Basic Research:

Utilize the websites below as well as others you find on your own and library resources to explore the city of Houston. The intention is for you to get to know the city and then represent this knowledge through a short – 5-10 minute presentation.

Templates:

Develop a series of ‘mapping templates’ which best represent an overall representation of a language which you identify as *your interpretation of the city*. The language is represented graphically through a series of individual sheets which together weave the language and are displayed through a series as a power point presentation. Examples are intentionally not provided. You are establishing this ‘language’, so it is important for you to consider how you would analyze and understand the city, and then represent this through a series of template studies.

Take this into consideration when analyzing the city. We will discuss this reading on Friday, January 16 as well. You may use Lynch’s five elements of urban form to organize your ideas, but you are not required to do this.
