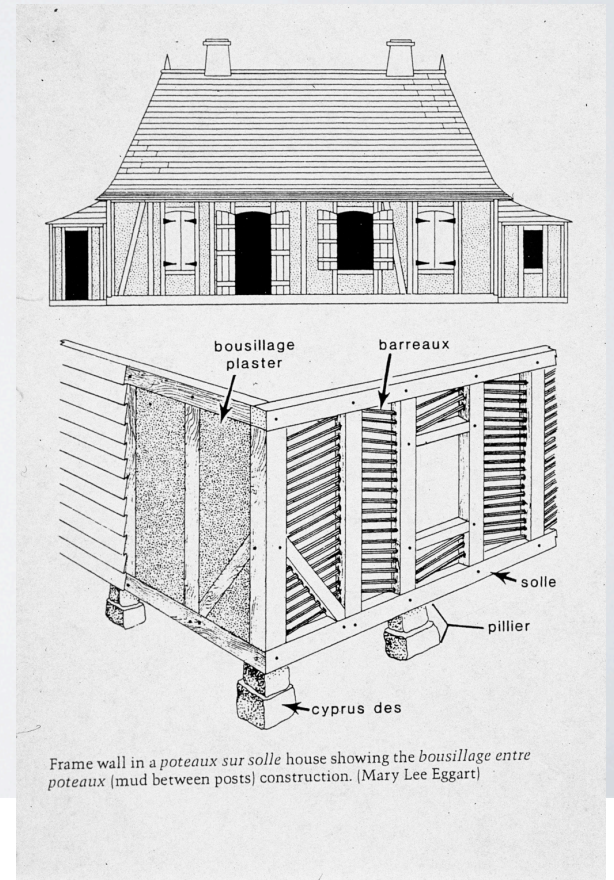

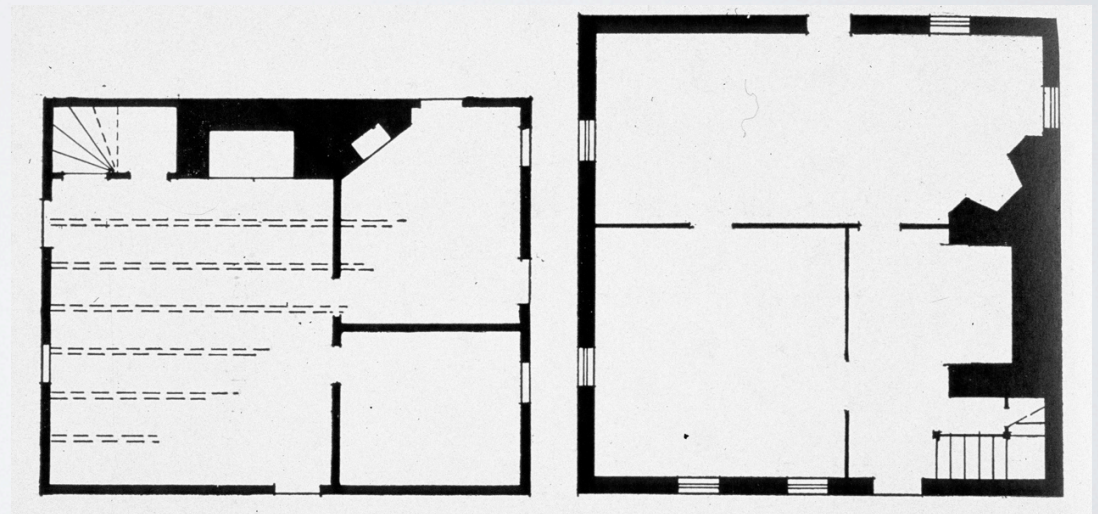

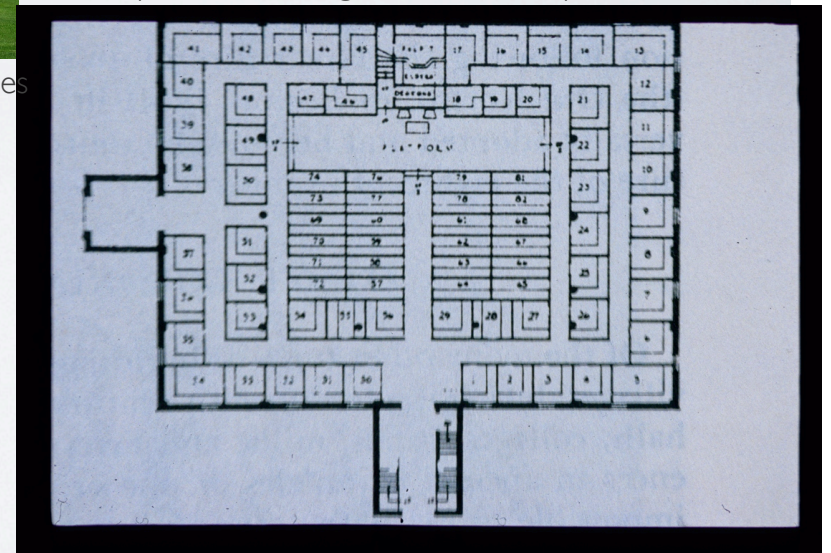

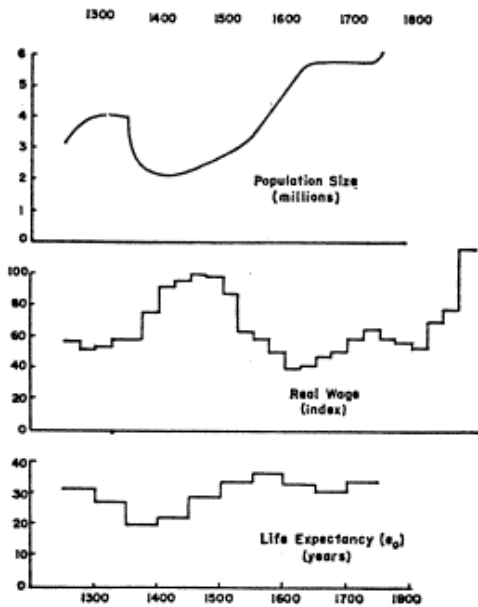

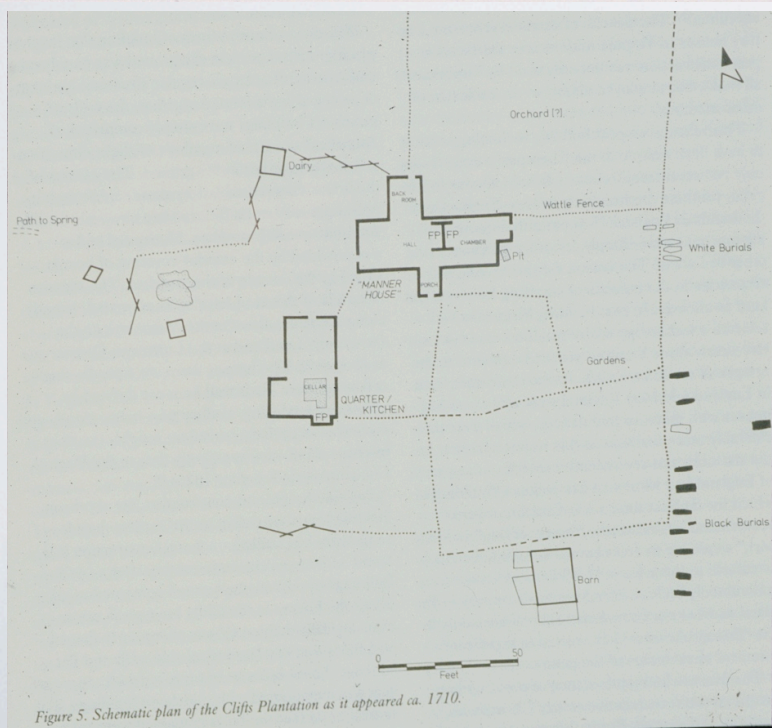
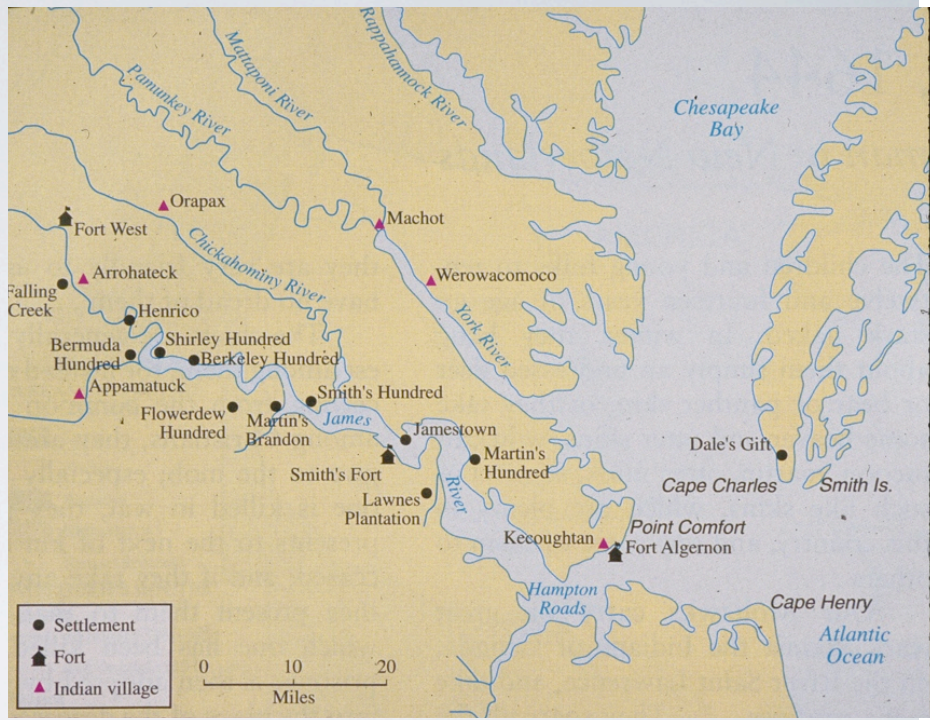
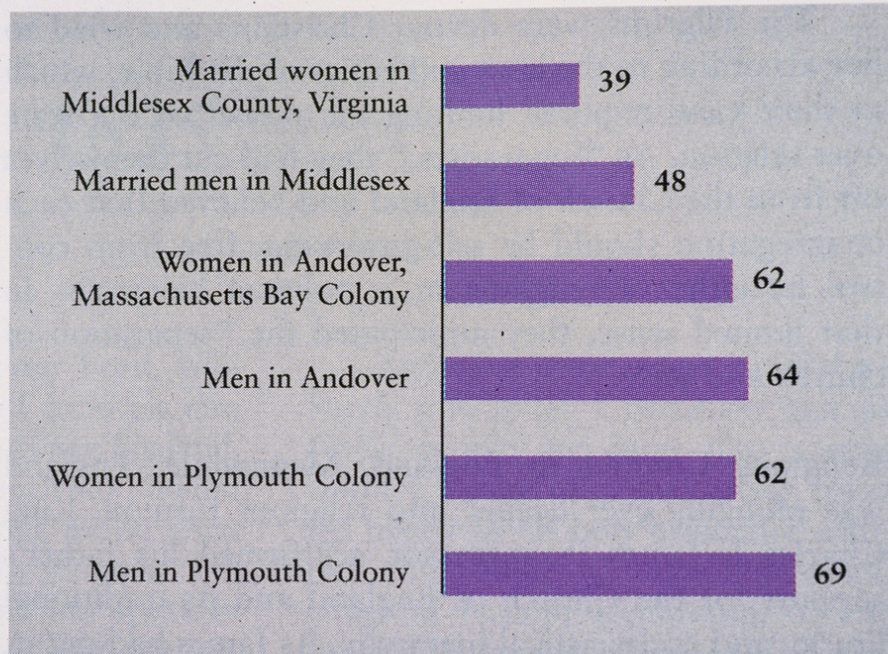
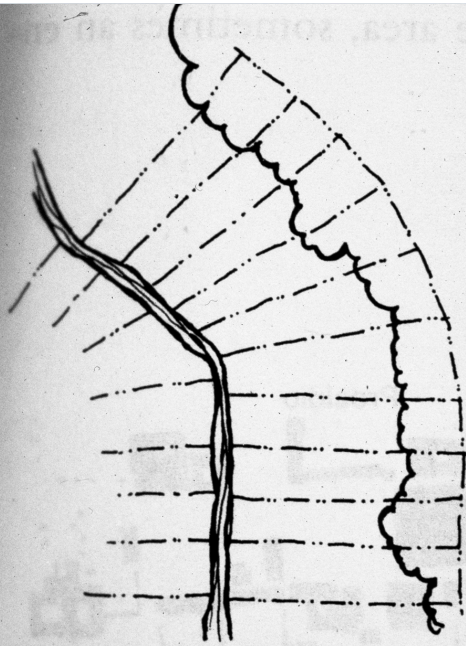


Figure 5. Schematic plan of the Clifts Plantation as it appeared ca. 1710.





Diagrammatic plan of typical long lot pattern along a river.

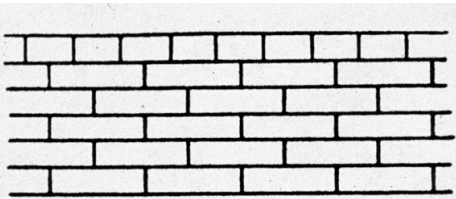


PITOT HOUSE IS AN EXAMPLE OF WEST INDIES ARCHITECTURE. THIS TYPE OF CONSTRUCTION IS WELL SUITED TO THE CLIMATE OF NEW ORLEANS SINCE LIKE THE WEST INDIES, IS HOT AND HUMID. THE HOUSE IS SUPPORTED BY A MASONRY CHAIN WALL FOUNDATION. THE FIRST LEVEL IS PAVED IN BRICK. THIS FLOORING, THOUGH NOT THE MOST ELEGANT, AIDES IN THE COOLING OF THE HOUSE AND BEARS WELL IN THE ROOMS USED FOR WORK, STORAGE, STORAGE AND DELIVERIES. ALL THE WALLS ON THE FIRST FLOOR ARE OF SOLID MASONRY CONSTRUCTION COVERED WITH STUCCO. THE LARGE COLOSSEAL COLUMNS ON THE FIRST LEVEL ARE ALSO MASONRY CONSTRUCTION COVERED WITH STUCCO. 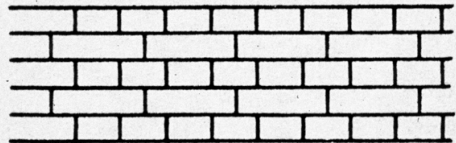
FIGURE 15. COOPER, 1910
